The Emerald Club favored us with a grand assortment of chicken wings from Eddie at Piggly Wiggly complemented by various sweets prepared by our very own Parrot Heads. DJ Rob got us all on the dance floor with a variety of songs from the past to the present and dancing the Cupid Shuffle was a highlight! Oh Yeah! And how about the "Crazy Hearts" game and our talented participants? The lucky winning pair, Lindsey and Clint, won chocolates of course, and announced that they were recently married so we helped them celebrate! Our 50/50 winner and favorite bartender, Matt, won \$67. Since February represents National Heart Month, the American Heart Association was chosen as our charity and, after additional donations were made later, a contribution of \$80 was made. There are lots of upcoming events, so make sure you check the Events section of the newsletter and mark them on your calendar. Our club submitted our Annual Report ,and low and behold we found out we are 10th in size of all the Clubs world wide! There are over 200 clubs and at 367 we top many larger cities. Right now (before we delete those who have moved on from our membership roles) we have exactly 400 members. What an amazing group of people.

Make sure you find us at the St. Patty's Day Festival on March 14th. There are a lot of us working the booths to welcome new members, help current members renew their membership and to help make sure the Riff Raff Raffle is a huge success. As you know, we alternate the charities we fundraise for and this year we have another new charity to highlight and support for St. Patty's Day.

We recently found out about a non-profit organization called **Family Promise of Carteret County** that

works with single moms with children, single dads with children and husbands and wives with children that have found them-



selves homeless. In the past The Parrot Head Club has provided support for Hope Mission (homeless shelter in Morehead City). which is only equipped to help homeless men. The Domestic Violence Program can only take women and children experiencing Domestic Violence. Since Family Promise of Carteret County opened their doors in September of 2011, they have served over 500 homeless individuals, in 2014 the organization served 222 individuals, partnered with 15 host churches, 18 support churches, hundreds of volunteers with one full-time paid staff. Family Promise of Carteret County partners with local churches to provide weekly shelter for guests and a home cooked meal daily. During the day guests are transported to the Day Center, located at 3502 Elm St. Morehead City, there they get their children off to school, receive help finding jobs and applying for housing. Most of this is done by volunteers (and you know how valuable a steady source of volunteers can be). Family Promise of Carteret County does not receive federal, state or local government funding, all funding is provided by local communities of faith, individuals, clubs, local grants, and fundraising. <u>Recently they have been checking their inventory and found that they are in real need of the following: Twin sheets sets, pillows, tooth paste, tooth brushes, shampoo and soap. IF YOU HAVE ANY OF THESE ITEMS TO DONATE, PLEASE BRING THEM TO THE FIRST FRIDAY PHLOCKING, WE WILL HAVE A BOX THERE.</u>

Of course money is always needed for client services, such as having cars repaired, (many of the clients live in their cars), paying for phone cards, dentist visits, etc. There have even been times when they have had to put some clients in a nearby Motel when the program is full especially when the weather is bad. I have included a bit more information taken from the Carteret Times News article from January 2013. To address the growing number of homeless, churches and agencies banded together to start Family Promise, which allows homeless women, single parents with children and married families to stay in churches. Families are housed on a rotating basis at 13 host churches in the county and use a day center at 3502 Elm St. in Morehead City for extra services during the day. More than 20 other churches provide additional support through various ways such as providing volunteers, transportation and financial support.

A maximum of 14 can be housed and fed at a host church in the evenings and return to the day center between 6:30 and 7 a.m. each day. The school system provides transportation to children from the day center.

Each church hosts families for one week. They then rotate through the 13 host churches over a three-month period, and then repeat the cycle up to one year.

While children go to school, adults either go to work or begin to receive intensive case management to identify what is preventing them from becoming self-sufficient. This is done through one-on-one counseling or meeting with local agencies that can assist them further.

Each participant has a plan developed to assist them, with graduates of the plan further assisted in setting up new homes. They are kept in contact with Family Promise for the next year.

Participants must take part in programs that address key life issues they face, which include: budgeting, daily life skills, stress management, communications, employment, parenting and nutrition. Family Promise collaborates with other community agencies to achieve this.

The day center provides non-working guests with a mailing address, phone and home base to conduct their housing search, care for pre-school children, seek employment opportunities, and advance their life skills or network with other social services agencies.

A van transports families without transportation to and from the day center. It also carries guests to scheduled appointments with local community agencies.

Those participating in the program are screened by agencies. No one with unmediated mental health issues, alcohol or drug addictions, or current legal or domestic violence issues can enter the program. If those entering the program are found in violation, they are asked to leave.
