May 1st - First Friday PHlocking was of course May Pole/Cinco De Mayo theme— we had a 50/50 raffle and raised \$86 for the Domestic Violence Program.

May 2nd – We had 5 Parrot Heads who assisted with the Bike The

Banks event to raise money for the Multi-Use Path. We also had a few Parrot Heads who participated.

May 5th – Cinco De Mayo PHlash PHlocking, last minute at the Wine Mixer in the Emerald Plantation with about 25 Parrot Heads in attendance. A nice evening out. May 16th - Our Beach Bike Poker Run was a huge success, with 213 riders. We had great feedback and everyone had a rowdy and fun time. We also ran a raffle and bike decoration contest with lots of donated prizes for both the raffle and Beach Bike Poker Run. We raised \$7,000 for the Semper Fi Oddessy Children's Summer Camp to send local children of Wounded Warriors to camp for a week and pairing with a mentor for a year.

June 5th– First Friday PHlocking was a 60"s & 70's Woodstock theme! The 50/50 raffle resulted in \$115 to Martha's Mission Food Cupboard. The oldie pictures were a hoot with the younger ones being pretty creative with their baby pictures and hand drawn sperm.

June 20th - The Longest Day Walk for Alzheimer's Association was a day long beach walk with shifts. The Club offered to spon-

sor each Parrot Head walker for \$10 a person and we had 30 PH walkers earn \$300 for this cause from the Club.

July 3rd - Another fun First Friday PHlocking, with of course a bit of red, white and blue. It was Christmas in July so there was also plenty of Red and Green. The 50/50 raffle raised \$100 for the Humane Society Animal Shelter and folks brought a lot of stuff to help out as well. Renee and Jack took a huge truck load of "stuff" to the shelter along with the check and they were so grateful, there may have been a few tears shed by all.

For the newbies, we always have some sort of fun activity game at each of the phlockings and different people are in charge of them each time, so you are always surprised by the creativity and nuttiness of the fun games.

On August 1st there was a PHlash PHlocking at the Stir It Up Coffee Shop and we had about 25 faithful Parrot Heads show up and catch up. Next Monday, August 3rd (oh dear, that is tomorrow.....) another PHlash PHlocking at the Irish Pirate to listen to DJ JD (John Dyer), so come on out and hang out with some tunes.

<u>August 7th 7 PM First Friday PHlocking</u> - August 7th Phlocking will be a Margaritaville Luau featuring DJ Rob with his usual selection of entertaining and danceable tunes. Wear your best island Luau attire, or at least something wild and festive!

August 9th Sunday - 1PM to 5 PM - Club Anniversary Island/Sandbar Party (13th anniversary of the Club) Yes, it is time again and we are hoping for the best of weather! Pelican Island is the site for the event, it is just off the shoreline of Swansboro, opposite the Swansboro Yacht Club, the island with a dock and flag. Low tide will be 9:55 and high tide is 4:35. Since this is our way of thanking all the members and volunteers for the good work and good deeds that have taken place over the year, the club will be providing hamburgers, hotdogs, (and rolls) condiments, paper products and music by Scearce and Ketner. OTHER COMMUNITY EVENTS AND OPPORTUNITIES FOR VOLUNTEERING

<u>September 5 (Monday) 6:30 at the Bogue Inlet Pier.</u> The Surfriders Foundation is working together with The Big Sweep to do a huge beach litter pick up. Looking for lots of volunteers. No need to bring anything, they have bags, gloves and buckets. Let's get out a full force of Parrot Heads and have a great time doing great things.

<u>September 26th (Saturday)</u> <u>Cycling for the Coast - NC Coastal Federation</u> - Bike Coastal North Carolina has some of the most spectacular and productive shorelines in the world. Help to protect, restore, and celebrate this treasure with a ride along the beautiful island of Bogue Banks. The goal of this event is to raise funds for the Coastal Federation's salt marsh and oyster habitat education programs. The ride is family friendly and great for all ages and biking levels, offering 20K (12.4 miles), 40K (24.8 miles) and 80K (49.7 miles) options. All cyclists will begin and end at Fort Macon State Park in Atlantic Beach.

Riders will leave in waves, beginning at 8:00 a.m. with the 80K group riding to Emerald Isle and back. The 40K, and then 20K riders will bike towards Emerald Isle, turning around at specified points on the island. Volunteers will be on hand to help with mechanical issues and safety. Snacks and water stops will also be provided.

The registration fee for Federation members is \$35 and for non-members is \$50.
