### **LOOK WHAT WE DID!**

There is no way to capture all the happenings this fall with Parrot Heads but I will give a shot at summarizing. Not an easy task as we were traveling all of October and missed all the fun stuff happening.

The October PHlocking was a warm up for the apple butter making. While we had to cancel that activity due to bad weather embracing our little Island, the PHlocking did happen and I am sure all had a good time, but have no idea what happened!!!!

The Diva Run for the Roses and tie dying of shirts was rescheduled. The Tie Dying took place at the Synan's house with Ann Marie in charge. I think there were about 75 shirts dyed and sold for \$15. I believe that the shirts with the Fishin' for a Cure were donated by Flipperz and that all were sold. The Apple Butter making started early on the morning of October 17th (no idea when the apples were peeled or by whom) and the smell of the cooking kept everyone waiting for the run drooling. This was the second year for the run and it is now a very popular event.

We raised \$2500 with the shirts, apple butter and Diva Run all for an amazing cause. (\$1700 last year) Since many of you may not know about the Fishin' for a Cure, I have included a little bit about this new local organization and what they do here in your own back yard.

Fishin' for a Cure is a non-profit 501(c)(3) organization with events based in Emerald Isle, NC. The goal of Fishin' for a Cure is to raise awareness of the importance of early detection as well as fighting to find a cure for women's cancers.

#### **HISTORY**

Fishin' for a Cure was created in October 2013. Originally, Fishin' for a Cure began with a small

group of women who wanted to take their friend, recently diagnosed with breast cancer, fishing. Over time the group of supportive friends grew and grew. In its first year as Fishin' for a Cure, the organization raised over \$21,000 to support local non-profit organizations. Since 2013, they have raised over \$60,000. The Kay Yow Cancer Fund, Friends of Greensboro for Early Detection and the Carteret Health Care Foundation have been recipients of these funds. In 2014, Fishin' for a Cure estab-

lished a Hope Fund. This money is earmarked specifically for cancer patients who may need assistance during their journey.



With that said, just a quick shout out to all

who helped make the October events a success. Krystal Tyndell and Kris Shoffner headed up the Fishn' for a Cure weeks of all sorts of events and hosted the apple butter making and the Diva Run. We were only part of the whole overall effort. Jessi Holland and a crew of lots of folks organized the Diva Run for the Roses where participants walked from Flipperz to the Emerald Club where there were a few special events held before everyone wandered back to Flipperz. Apple Butter making was organized by Renee and Jack Synan with the expertise provided by Synan's good friends Cindy and Kenny Garner from Virginia. The Tie Dying of shirts was hosted by Synans with the expertise provided by Ann Marie Phillips of Ann Marie Yoga. An awesome job by all, participants and organizers.
